Finally, the Program Delegate decides whether Program funding will be granted, and on what terms and conditions.

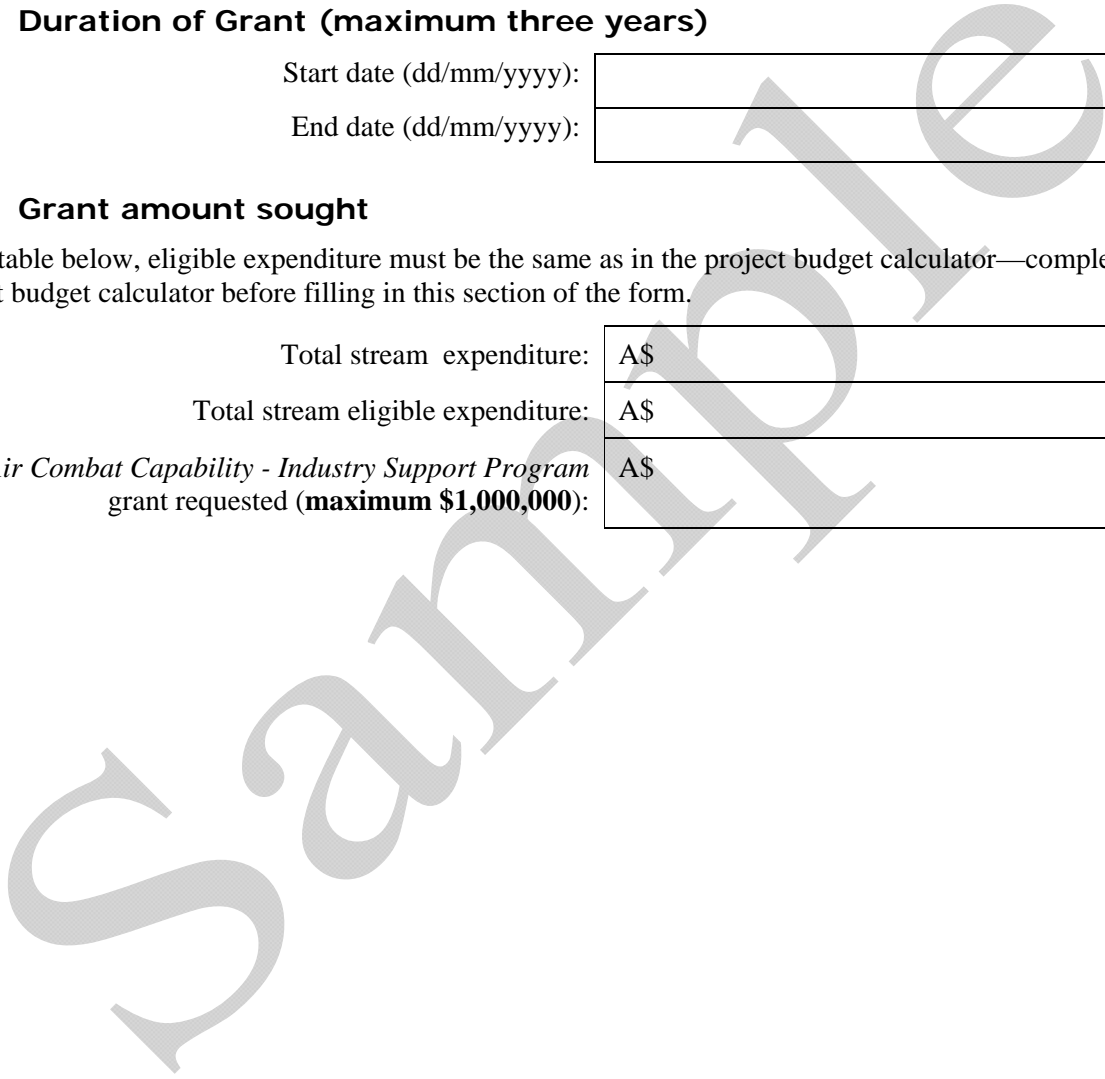

## **Appendix B Evidence of Matching Funding**

### **Evidence of matching funding—mandatory attachment**

The following is a guide for the mandatory attachment that constitutes evidence of ability to provide matching funding at the rate eligible expenditure is to be incurred on the project.

#### **Accountant's letter**

The applicant must provide a letter demonstrating it meets the following *New Air Combat Capability - Industry Support Program* eligibility condition:

- the applicant must be able to demonstrate it is solvent and has the ability to fund the cost of the project not met by the *New Air Combat Capability - Industry Support Program* grant. The applicant must give the Commonwealth details of any financial assistance the Project receives from another Commonwealth, State or Territory government source or agency, including the amount of the funding, the source of funding and the terms and conditions under which it was provided.

The letter must also detail that the *New Air Combat Capability - Industry Support Program* project budget calculator was sighted (and note the amount sighted) when considering the applicant's ability to meet the matching funding eligible applicant condition.

#### **Preparation of the letter**

The letter must be prepared and signed by a person who:

- is not a director, other office holder, or employee of the applicant or related body corporate of the applicant;
- has not been engaged by the applicant for the purpose of preparing the *New Air Combat Capability - Industry Support Program* application;
- has no financial interest in the applicant; and
- is a current member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia; or the Society of Certified Practising Accountants; or the National Institute of Accountants as a Public Practice Certified Member.

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**Format of the letter**

The letter must include the following:

- the statement: 'On the basis of the evidence [Applicant Name] has supplied to me, I consider that [Applicant Name] is solvent and able to fund its share of the cost of the proposed *New Air Combat Capability - Industry Support Program* project'. This opinion is based on total project expenditure of [\$ project expenditure].
